

To apply, please submit the following:

- 1. Admission application: either the Common App or Anna Maria's online application at annamaria.edu/admission/transfer
- 2. A \$25 application fee (may be waived for eligible students)
- **3.** Official transcripts from your high school (or GED/HiSet results) and all colleges/universities attended

What credits will transfer?

We typically grant credits for college courses taken at a regionally accredited institution and comparable to those we offer, with up to 75 credits accepted for students without a previously earned bachelor's degree and up to 90 credits for students pursuing a second bachelor's degree. For most courses a grade of C- or better is required for the credits to transfer. Bring your transcripts to our Office of Admission and we will give you an on-the-spot evaluation.
