#### PRESIDENTIAL ANNOUNCEMENT



President Mary Lou Retelle announced last summer that this academic year (2024-25) will be her last as president. Her impending retirement marks the conclusion of a decade marked by transformation, resilience, and unwavering dedication to the College's mission.

President Retelle acknowledges the steadfast support of the Board



The Board of Trustees of Anna Maria College recently announced the appointment of Dr. Sean J. Ryan as the institution's 12th president, effective July 1, 2025. The Board's vote was unanimous. Dr. Ryan will succeed President Mary Lou Retelle, who has led the College since 2015.

A New England native, Dr. Ryan joins Anna Maria College from

of Trustees, faculty, and staff in navigating unprecedented hurdles such as the pandemic, economic shifts, demographic changes, and skepticism about the future of private colleges.

A poignant highlight of President Retelle's reflection is her deep appreciation for Anna Maria's students, whom she describes as the "heart and soul" of her leadership. "Every decision I made was guided by their educational dreams and aspirations," she affirms, emphasizing the profound impact of their journey at Anna Maria.

Rooted in the values instilled by the Sisters of Saint Anne, who founded Anna Maria College in 1946, President Retelle underscores the enduring relevance of these principles in today's educational landscape. "These values are more relevant now than ever," she notes, emphasizing their integration into every aspect of teaching and student support beyond the classroom.

"Dr. Ryan's impressive track record in leadership, commitment to Catholic higher education, and proven success in enrollment growth and financial management make him exceptionally qualified to lead Anna Maria College into its next chapter.

Dr. Ryan's passion for our mission and ability to articulate our values while honoring the College's rich tradition founded by the Sisters of Saint Anne perfectly aligns with our vision for the future."



Monday, May 12th at 10 am in the DCU Center Arena, Worcester.


No tickets or limit required for guests; student RSVP required. Doors open for students at 8:30 am. **Graduates must arrive at the lineup area by 9:00 am!**




Don't want to drag everything home just to drag it back in the fall? Need a space to store your items? AMC has partnered with College Boxes to make move-out and move-in easy!










### **Club Hockey to Nationals**
