Saint Olga

St. Olga was born in Russia in A.D. 879, and was raised with no faith. She married lgor, the heir Prince of Kiev, and became a princess. Together they had three children. Her husband was assassinated, and those same enemies attempted to force Olga into a false marriage in order to expand their kingdom. Enraged, Olga ordered that her guards bury two dozen of the enemy ambassadors alive. She also demanded that some of the ambassadors be burned to death, and that others were slain. She also had her guards and military take over the enemies' cities and kill their citizens, and sell the rest into slavery. Nine years later, Olga was travelling through

Constantinople and she encountered the Gospel, and her life turned completely around. She dedicated the rest of her life to telling people about the mercy and love of Jesus, repenting for her sins, serving the poor, and using her power as a princess to spread & support Christianity throughout her region. St. Olga teaches us that even the coldest and darkest of hearts can be turned around by the word of God.
